Please read this form carefully. Your signature/Initials on this form states that you have read, understand and agree to all the policies of Storybook Kids.

There is a registration fee due per child due upon completing this registration packet at initial sign-up and every year for Fall registration. This fee maybe increased in the future and is non-applicable toward tuition and is non-refundable. If your child does not start the program, under any circumstances, you will not be refunded _____

Storybook Kids Mantra

We are a fully licensed New York State Childcare Center. Storybook Kids provides services for infants and toddlers. We also have a full-service Nursery school serving Preschool and Pre-Kindergarten age children. Our focus is on children six weeks old to pre-kindergarten. Every year we graduate our Pre-K children and see them off to kindergarten prepared physically and emotionally.

We create a safe, warm, and friendly environment for your child to learn and thrive. Our goal is for your child to learn social skills and learn how to interact with their peers as well as be ready to enter Kindergarten. By providing daycare and a school all in one, parents can enroll their older children in a school setting while still having a safe daycare setting for their infants. We also provide a delicious healthy Menu of breakfast, lunch, snack and drinks for your convenience.

Storybook Kids is independently owned and operated by a private owner, Michelle Sowacki. Michelle has three children of her own who have all gone to Storybook Kids. She is running the school as an owner as well as a parent and understands the needs of families and children from a personal perspective.

Storybook Kids also has a great management team with a Director and Assistant Director that help run the school and can assist parents with any of their needs.

The School was founded in 2015, it was formally a corporate franchised daycare and then bought out and recreated. Storybook Kids currently only has one flagship location and is free to create an environment free of any restrictions or having to follow any corporate guidelines, such as other schools its size. This separates us from the competition because we can create a school that works for parents and children and the individual needs of the school without any restrictions.

We want to create a fun, positive environment for your child and hire educated and happy staff to oversee your children. We are open year-round; we are only closed on major holidays to accommodate working parents. Our summer session runs the same great program as our regular school year but incorporates water play into our outdoor time. We have open enrollment all year long and can accept children at any time into any of our programs, if we have a spot available. My child/children's continued enrollment at Storybook Kids constitutes my agreement to abide by all the following policies and state regulations.

TUITION AND LATE FEES

There are four ways to pay:

1. **Checks:** must be made out to Storybook Kids Prep.
2. **Cash:** (Receipts are given) Must be given in a sealed envelope with your child's name and amount. It must only be given to a member of administrative staff. We are not responsible for lost money given in any other way, such as backpack or given to a teacher in the classroom.
3. **Credit/Debit** - there is a 4% fee
4. **Automatic payments** from your checking account through Procure, This must be set up by the front desk. You will fill out form with your routing and checking information. Also attach a voided check.

Upon registration, the first week's tuition is due. If you are a weekly payer, your next payment is due by the first Friday or a late fee of \$15 is charged. If you pay monthly, we deduct the first week and you will owe less the first month. Monthly payments are due by the 5th of the month, or a \$25 late fee is charged. Any bounced tuition will incur a \$35 fee. After two delinquencies, only cash can be accepted.

The enrolling parent must make the full payment and collect the share of the other person or parent on their own. We cannot split payments and only the enrolling parent can receive tuition receipts. Please note that any delinquent payments will be reported to the necessary credit agencies, and we will pursue any uncollected debts by legal means. You will be responsible for any legal charges incurred. If tuition is delinquent, your child will not be admitted into the school until the balance is paid in full. You will also keep incurring late fees until the full payment is made.

If you leave the program with a past due balance, you understand that you will be sent to collections. If you decide to leave the program permanently, a month notice must be giving to the front desk in writing. Tuition must be paid up until that date. If you leave the program unannounced, you will receive a tuition bill for one month that must be paid.

School Holiday Closures and Vacations

Parents must pay for all school closings. We do not follow the school district calendar. We are only closed on major holidays, one staff day in August and one and a half weeks, in December for Christmas break to New Years day. Snow days and emergency closures will not be reimbursed from tuition. Makeup days are not available for any reason.

You must still pay for Snow days and school closures for any reason such as a power outage, natural disaster, pandemics, cleaning or quarantining due to Covid -19, strikes or any other major incident. You must also pay the full tuition if your child is not in school from an illness or vacation. There will be no sick credits but one half priced vacation week credit can be applied to your account once a year from September to August. Your account must be in good standing and you must have been enrolled in the program for at least 3 months. If you don't use it by August, it does not roll over to the next year. You must notify the front desk to have the credit applied to your account at the time of vacation. Your child must physically be out of school for the whole week to get this credit. The only blackout week that the credit cannot be used is the Christmas week that we are closed.

If a child or parent needs to quarantine for any reason, you must still pay your full tuition, even if the classroom or school as a whole must quarantine. If your child has a sibling in the school, they will have to quarantine, your tuition is due as well. We will notify you of a return date as per the Department of Health. You must notify the school if you or your child is positive and supply us with a doctor's note with a return date. As an essential business we will remain

open during a pandemic unless we feel the need to close for a short time or are mandated to do so.

I received a copy of Storybook Kid's yearly holiday closure list and understand that I must pay if the school is closed for any reason or I keep my child home for any reason. _____

Schedule Days and Hours

I understand that once I give in my schedule, including days and hours to the school that I must abide by my schedule. If I pick up my child late, I will pay a late fee of a varying amount set by the school depending on how late I am. Late fees are listed below.

- 6:05 pm - \$5
- 6:10 pm - \$10
- 6:15 pm - \$15
- 6:20 pm - \$20
- 6:25 pm - \$25
- 6:30 pm - \$30

If your child is not picked up by when the school closes at 6:00 PM and you have not called to let us know, the police may be contacted at the school's discretion. We will do our best to call anyone listed on your emergency contact to inform them that we cannot get in touch with you and we need an emergency contact to pick up your child because the school is closed. In the rare instance that no one can be notified or gotten in touch with, the child would be released to police custody.

If you need to permanently change your schedule, you must let the front desk know and your tuition will be adjusted. Schedule changes cannot be guaranteed and are on a case-by-case basis. You cannot bring your child on days that they are not scheduled for, unless otherwise approved by the front desk and or owner. We need to keep ratios in the classroom and cannot have children show up unannounced that are not scheduled. If you would like to add a day that you are not scheduled for, please let us know in advance and we will charge you a daily rate if we have availability for your child to come.

I understand that I must follow the schedule I signed up for or permanently change my schedule if approved.

Transitioning Rooms-

Infants- We separate children based on their mobility and cognitive ability. As per New York State, infants are considered 6 weeks to 18 months. Since we are a larger program, we can separate older and younger infants and keep mobile infants together. In our younger infant program, they focus on tummy time, reading stories, soothing music and blowing bubbles. Younger infants tend to sleep more, and we keep a serene quiet environment for them. In our older infant room, where they are more mobile and stay awake longer, we can accommodate a more stimulating environment which includes art projects, music and playground time. Children may transition throughout the year from younger to older infant rooms at any time.

Toddlers- When infants reach 18 months, they are then considered toddlers as per New York State. They would then be required to move one more time into a younger toddler room. They will be with other younger toddlers that just transitioned from the infant room, separate from our older toddler rooms. We will notify you once your child is ready to transition. Toddlers who start the year at 18months or older remain in the same room for the entire year.

Preschool/Pre-K Program- They will remain with their classrooms throughout the regular school year. In the summer, children either remain in their same rooms or may move to a different camp room based on enrollment and availability. Every September we try to keep most of the same children together and move them up to a new teacher. If you feel your child is not getting along with a student in their class, or you would like to request to have or not have a specific teacher, please inform the front desk. Please put it in writing and we will consider it when we are scheduling classrooms.

Non-Discrimination Policy

Our program is designed for children from six weeks to Prekindergarten. Storybook Kids except all children on a first come, first serve basis. We do not discriminate on the basis of race, gender, religion or national origin. Storybook Kids only accepts children that can function in their specific classroom and are able to participate emotionally and physically in school activities. Storybook Kids will accept children with special needs where reasonable accommodation is possible. If we find that we cannot accommodate a child's needs, we will contact the parent and inform them to reach out to Early Intervention to get their child evaluated. If a child is a harm to themselves or anyone else, they can be asked to leave the program at any time.

Storybook Kids cannot accommodate having a one-on-one teacher with an individual child. We follow NY state ratios in classrooms and must be able to supervise all the children equally. If a child cannot follow the classroom schedule on their own and needs to be assisted by a specific person, Early Intervention may recommend sending a SEIT from a supporting agency. If necessary, Storybook Kids will gladly speak with your child's physician, therapist and or other professionals to accommodate the child or to make a referral to a more appropriate setting if necessary. We want all children to thrive in our program but understand some children need individual attention that our school cannot provide as a General Education Program. We allow outside agencies to come into our school to provide services for your child's such as speech, physical therapy, or any other therapies your child qualifies for.

I understand the non-discriminatory policy and believe my child is a good candidate for Storybook Kids.

Curriculum

At Storybook Kids we believe educating children happens through academics as well as play. We are using a new, award-winning Curriculum customized to your child's educational level. Socialization is an especially important component to our curriculum and the children pretend play and use their imagination while socializing with their peers. We also believe outdoor play is important for children and weather permitting; they go outside twice a day. We believe the foundation for reading and writing is especially important, and we use curriculum to incorporate literacy in our lesson plans. The earlier children are exposed to our curriculum, the easier it will be for them to transition into a Kindergarten setting. All our teachers meet the educational requirements of New York State. Our teachers all follow lesson plans overseen by our Center Director.

Medical Care

I must notify Storybook at enrollment or as soon as an illness or food allergy is diagnosed by a doctor. If medication must be held on site, I understand I need additional medical paperwork signed by my child's doctor. The medication must be given to us in the original box and match exactly with the Doctor's description. Storybook Kids' administrative staff are Mat-trained and can administer medicine. All medical conditions and allergies must be known before entering the program. We will do our best to accommodate children with different medical concerns. Depending on the severity of the situation, we may or may not be able to admit a child into the program.

If your child has a medical concern that must be taken care of throughout the day in the classroom, an individual teacher may not be able to accommodate that medical condition as well as supervise the rest of the class. Medical conditions that can be accommodated are done by the front desk administrative staff, such as giving nebulizer treatments. Our school is peanut free and all children with a peanut allergy must have an EpiPen and any other medications that a doctor has recommended be kept on site, in addition to the regular medical paperwork that all children must have before entering the school. Children with medical conditions and allergies must have additional medical paperwork and an individual healthcare plan filled out before the start of their first day. In the event that your child has a serious medical episode or accident while in our care, 911 will first be called, and then the parent will immediately be notified. If the parent cannot arrive before the ambulance a member of Storybook Kids staff, will ride in the ambulance with your child and remain at the hospital until the parent arrives.

I authorize Storybook Kids to call 911 in the event my child has a medical episode or is injured and accompany my child in the ambulance if necessary. _____

Child's Medical and Immunizations

Storybook Kids follows NYS Immunization guidelines. There are currently no religious exemptions in NYS. Any mandatory immunizations are required in any licensed daycare. We cannot by law make any exceptions for parents. NYS keeps track in a database with all daycares to ensure compliance. No Child Will Be Admitted to School without the Following: A current OCFS Medical Form based off your child receiving a physical within the last year. It must be filled out correctly with up-to-date immunizations, make sure it says "OCFS" on the top of your form and the Doctor's office didn't give you an elementary school form instead. The second page of the form must be checked; (Yes) the child may go to Daycare and be signed and stamped by the Doctor's office. Immunizations can be accepted as a separate document but must be in addition to the OCFS form. We must have the medical form back at least one day before new enrollment to the program. Once enrolled it is the parent's responsibility to keep up with all immunizations and give a copy to the front desk. You must also have your child receive a physical once per year, this is usually done right after their birthday. If your child is missing any immunizations or yearly physicals, the front desk will let you know how long your child must receive it based on NYS guidelines.

I understand my child must keep up with their immunizations and yearly physicals and I received an OCFS medical form to bring to my child's pediatrician to have signed and returned to Storybook Kids.

Food Policy

Breakfast, Lunch, afternoon snacks and drinks are included in the price. We will provide you with a menu of all food and drinks that are served. If the menu is changed, we will notify you by posting the new menu on Procare. If a child does not want to eat the food on the menu, we have backup sandwiches. If a child will not eat, parents will be notified on Procare or through a phone call. Outside food is allowed in but it must not be made in a tree nut/peanut facility. Please bring food and snacks with original packaging. If you make your child's food, it must be labeled what it is with all the ingredients.

You must also label it with your child's first and last name. All bottles and sippy cups must also be labeled. All formula bottles must be premade, although we cannot mix them, we can warm them. If a child has any kind of food allergies, we cannot provide any food to that child in case of any food contamination. If this is the case only drinks will be served, and the parent must provide all food and snacks. If you decide to bring in your own food, or have a child with a food allergy, there is no adjustment in tuition.

I understand and will comply with the Food policy of the school and received a menu. _____

Communicable Diseases

If your child is sick and you take them to the doctor, and they're diagnosed with a communicable disease that is contagious to others, you must notify us immediately. We will protect the confidentiality of your child but must post what that illness is to your child's classroom anonymously. If your child has an illness that is very contagious like lice, ringworm or the coxsackie virus, they may need to stay out of the building until they are no longer contagious with a note from a licensed physician or clinician. If your child has molluscum they must have all sores covered with Band-Aids in order to remain in school. If they fall off throughout the day Storybook Kids will be able to supply your child with additional Band-Aids.

I understand if I find out my child has something contagious that I will inform the school and keep them out until they are no longer contagious. _____

General Sick Policy

During Covid, our Covid policy supersedes our regular sick policy when it comes to Fever. Our sick policy states that if a child has a fever of 100.4, they are not allowed to be in school. Any child with a fever cannot return until 24 hours fever free from the time they leave the building.

I agree for my child to be excluded from their classroom when they are sick and are waiting for pickup. I have also read the sick policy of the school and I understand when they may and may we not return to class.

Items to bring from home:

All ages must provide clean sheets and blankets for the child that are laundered and brought back each week. Extra clothing, including socks and sneakers. Diapers and baby wipes.

Infant: Labeled bottles, a diaper bag, diapers, wipes, bibs, pacifiers and or teethingers, sleep sacks (no blankets)

Toddler: 2 Labeled sippy cups, diapers, wipes, book bag or a small backpack

Preschool/Pre-K: Marble Notebook, pencils, markers, crayons, backpack and 2 pocket folder

Releasing of Children

Storybook Kids will only release your child to go home with a parent or other person named by the enrolling parent. If you would like to take somebody off this list, please notify us immediately and we will have you initial that this person may no longer pick up your child. If you were in a situation where nobody on your pickup list can pick up your child, please call the school and an additional person can be added for that day.

The person coming to pick up your child must be at least 18 years old and have a valid driver's license. We will make a copy and keep it in your file. Anybody picking up your child should have their own car seat and be able to transport your child safely home. In the case of any court proceedings, please bring us documentation of a parent not being able to pick up their child in a custody case.

I understand nobody else, besides whom I name will be able to leave with my child from the center and I have completed the authorized pick-up form. _____

Dress Code

Please dress your child in comfortable clothes where they can feel free to play outside and get dirty. In the event that your child has an accident or gets too dirty, we can change them as long as you have provided a change of clothes. Please also send your child in with a jacket in the fall and winter. Children will be going outside and may not be permitted to go outside in low temperatures without a jacket. Please also provide a hat during the winter months. It is best to dress your child in layers, as the children are running around; they may get hot but then with the air conditioning they may get cold.

By dressing them in layers your child can be comfortable and take a piece of clothing on or off as they see fit. If you put your child in a dress, it is best to also have leggings underneath. This will prevent them from hurting their legs on the playground as well as showing any undergarments. They must be wearing appropriate footwear and able to run around the classroom and playground. In the summer, children will wear bathing suits underneath their clothing and be changed back after water-play. Only secure water shoes are allowed, and flip-flops will not be permitted.

Please don't dress your child depicting anything violent or controversial. Please do not have your child come in with any expensive jewelry or valuable item that could get lost, stolen or destroyed. If anything is lost, we do have a lost and found and you can feel free to contact the front desk to see if your item was found. Storybook Kids is not responsible for any dry-cleaning bills or to reimburse for any lost jewelry or clothing items.

Water Days are scheduled for two days during AM playground time. The days will be announced.

Summer Dress Code: Please provide your child with their own towel, additional bag to carry wet items, and proper water shoes. Please no flip flops, make sure that your child's shoes are skid free with enclosed toes. The child should wear a bathing suit underneath their clothes. Please make sure that you pack additional under garments.

Outside Toy Policy

Storybook Kids provides children with educational toys that they can use throughout the day. If your child has a favorite toy that they will not leave the house without, you are permitted to bring it into the school. It must be kept inside the child's cubby and only taken out during naptime. We are not responsible for any lost items brought in from home. No toys that can be considered a weapon are allowed in the building at any time including light sabers, swords, baseball bats and toy or water guns.

Napping Policy

Children cannot be forced to stay awake. A medical note must be provided and kept on file to keep children awake that otherwise would be napping. Children that don't nap will be given a quiet activity on their mat or at a table and be always supervised by a teacher. Younger infants will nap in cribs. Full-time infants will have their own cribs and part time infants will share with other part timers. All cribs and mattresses are cleaned daily. Older infants through Pre-K will sleep on individual cots, separated through the classroom. All the bedding will be provided by parents, washed and brought back every week to the school. Infant crib sheets are standard porta crib size. For cots, we recommend a fitted twin sheet.

Potty Training Policy

Parents must provide diapers and wipes for children who are not potty trained. Children do not need to be potty trained to enter any program. We have potties in all classrooms from toddlers to school age. Your child must be able to verbally tell the teacher that they need to use the bathroom. We can assist children but cannot put them on the potty, if they are not interested. There is no potty-training requirement to move up into a preschool class. We don't put children into underwear until they have been **COMPLETELY** accident free at the Center for two full weeks. Parents will work with teachers on their child's progress. Food cannot be used as a reward for Potty training. Other forms of rewards such as sticker charts may be brought in by a parent and used if agreed by Management. Pull-ups may be worn during nap time and parents must provide extra change of clothing in case of accidents.

Communication

Communication between staff and parents at Storybook Kids is our highest priority. If you would like to speak with your child's Teacher during the day, please feel free to call the front desk and we will connect you to the room. You can also message their teacher through our Procure App.

Please call the Center for any emergencies or important information. Procure messages may not be seen by management right away. If your child will be absent or on vacation, please call the main number to inform us. Any issues or questions that you may have should be directed to our center Director, who may be reached on our main number (631) 661-4000.

Please notify an administrative member or the owner if you have any concerns or are not satisfied with anything. Slander of the school or any of its employees through any form of social media or word of mouth will not be permitted. Any billing inquiries or unresolved issues may be addressed to the Owner directly. Call or text the owner at 631-275-2500.

I understand the communication policy. _____

Procare Through our communication app, parents are updated throughout the day. All diaper changes, meals and day-to-day information will be posted. Teachers will also post pictures of your child and keep you informed if there is anything that needs to be brought in, such as extra diapers or baby wipes. You can also communicate back-and-forth with the teacher through the procare messenger feature. You must download the app on your phone and it will start working the first day your child starts. You must give us your email in order to connect the app. Both parents can use the app and need to provide their own email per each account.

This app is only for parents and we can have up to two parents connected to any individual child. If you have siblings in the school, you will be able to see all your children connected to your one app. If you would like to be billed from your checking account through the app, you must inform the front desk for them to set up a plan. Our teachers update the procare app in the classrooms from their Storybook Kids device. This may not always be in real time, since supervising the children is their main objective. Since this is a touch screen device, there is some margin of error. There may be some instances where we may tap your child by accident and check them out of the classroom by accident. This does not mean that your child has physically left the building.

Discipline Policy

Storybook Kids Follows the New York State regulations that bans exclusion of any child, therefore there is no time-out. We do use redirection, in which teachers try to redirect negative behaviors of children by getting them interested in something else positive to do in the classroom. If your child is exhibiting any negative behavior in the classroom, you will be notified by the Director and or Owner. The teacher will keep logs of any negative behavior and inform the parents on Procare or by a phone call. If we feel the negative behavior is getting worse or the child harms themselves, the teacher or any other children, a meeting will be set up with Storybook and the child's parent. Although most discipline situations can be worked out, there may be some instances where the child may need to leave the program immediately. Your child may be asked to leave the program at any time if we feel they are a danger to themselves or other children/adults.

Employee Policy

Storybook Kids is only responsible for its employees during their paid working hours. We ask that you refrain from hiring our employees for secondary babysitting jobs on nights and weekends to prevent a conflict of interest and or favoritism of a child. If a parent decides on their own to hire an employee against our policy, we are not responsible for anything that employee does outside of our building. Under no circumstances can a parent hire one of our trained teachers to leave our program to work for them permanently instead.

I understand that by agreeing to this policy Storybook Kids can take legal action against me if I were to disenroll from the program and have a teacher leave to watch my child. _____

Harassment Policy

Storybook Kids will not allow harassment of any employee of the company. A parent may be asked to leave the program if they make an employee feel physically or emotionally harassed. Any inappropriate behavior will be addressed with a parent once we are informed by an employee.

There is a zero-tolerance policy for any relationships between parents and employees beyond the scope of childcare during school hours. Employees and parents should only communicate during school hours through Procare, through the school's tablets or school phones. No parent should reach out to an employee on Facebook or personal cell phone and vice versa. This creates a conflict of interest with the school and can make the employee or school feel uncomfortable. No verbal or physical abuse will be tolerated in person or through any secondary means of communication.

I understand and will abide by the Harassment Policy. _____

Incident Reports

If your child bites another child or is involved in any type of incident or accident throughout the day you will receive an incident report. We will also call you or possibly send you a picture on Procure depending on the situation, to inform you of the incident. We will then have the parents sign off that they know about the incident and return the report to the front desk. If your child needs to be taken to an urgent care or emergency room based on an incident that happened in our school, we need to be notified immediately and receive an update on when they were able to return to school and if they need any modifications.

I understand that if there was an incident the school I would need to sign the incident report and return it to the front desk. _____

Confidentiality

All information provided to Storybook kids will be kept confidential. We cannot release parent's phone numbers or any other information. If your child is involved in an incident with another child, the other child's identity will not be revealed without prior written consent from the parent/guardian except where required or prohibited by law. We need parents to give us cell phone numbers and work numbers of anyone that can pick up their child due to an illness or emergency. If any of your emergency contact information changes throughout the year you must notify us at the front desk to give us any updated addresses or phone numbers. If you would like to give out invitations, you can give them to the teacher to send home. If you are looking for an individual's phone number, we would have to notify them first for them to agree to give out their number.

I understand my information will not be shared with any third-party. I also will not give out confidential information about Storybook Kids such as pricing and or other confidential policies and materials.

Emergency Evacuation Site

Storybook Kids is a fully fire sprinkled site. We conduct one fire drill per month as well as two shelter in place drills per year. In the event of a fire or any other emergency Storybook kids would leave the building and go to our emergency evacuation site. Infants would be pushed in emergency evacuation cribs and older children would walk with their classroom teachers. All parents would be called and notified to pick up their child at the secondary site. The current site is Big Lots.

I have been informed of where the emergency evacuation site is and agree for my child to be able to leave the building in an emergency. _____

Inclement Weather and Emergency Closings

Storybook Kids will be closed in the event of inclement weather that provides a danger for staff and children from getting into the building. We may also be closed due to a hurricane, natural disaster, riot, pandemic, or power outage. In the event of an emergency closing, parents will be notified first through the procure App. Secondly, we may also be listed on news 12 and our Facebook page. Please request us to be friends on our main Facebook page to receive important updates and information.

I understand where I can find school emergency closures. _____

Smoking and Alcohol

Storybook Kids is a smoke free environment in compliance with local, state, and federal laws. We ask that you do not smoke in the Center or on the center's property. We ask that you do not come into the center smelling of smoke from any substances. We also ask that you do not consume any alcohol before coming into our Center. We cannot release a child to any person to be taken home that smells of alcohol.

Birthday and Party Policy

You can also bring decorations such as plates, cups, tablecloths, and a birthday banner. Balloons will only be permitted if they are Mylar not latex. Pizza may be ordered from any pizzeria. You can provide peanut-free goody bags that will go home with the children so parents can decide if they want their child to have it. Please let the front desk and teacher know in advance if you are planning a celebration.
